Trustees' Annual Report (continued) Year ended 31 December 2022

The Trustees' present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2022. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 8 to the accounts.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Beith Parish Church is ecumenical in outlook, and supports many Charities through local ecumenical activities, in particular involvement with the Christian Action thrift shop and continued support of the North Ayrshire foodbank. Beith Parish Church holds weekly Church Services with an early morning additional family service held monthly on a trial basis. There is a Junior Sunday Club for Pre School and Primary age children which also meets weekly and A Sunday Club is operated for Secondary age pupils. Services are frequently held in Local Care Homes. "Messy Church" events continue to encourage wider community outreach by involvement in these initiatives. The Guild meet regularly. A Social Committee organises various functions throughout the year.

Achievements and Performance

Attendance at Communion Services was around 90 with an average weekly attendance at Church of approx 65. The numbers have not recovered to the pre pandemic levels. The streaming of Services online continues thanks to the new AV system and the volunteers trained to operate it. Since the minister retired in September 2022 an excellent job has been done by volunteer elders taking Sunday services. A rolling programme has been ongoing, in line with the National Stewardship campaign with a month being dedicated each year. In 2022 we focused on talents with a themed service. 2023 is due to focus on money but discussion will take place how to approach this in the current economic climate.

Financial Review

The principal source of income is weekly offerings, either by WFO envelope, Standing order or open plate, with as many members as possible contributing by Gift Aid. These weekly offerings are up 0.6% at £65.8k in 2022, against the 2021 figure of £65.2k, mainly due to an increase in open plate with members returning. The Social Committee Events have not yet returned to pre pandemic levels. The General accounts are down by £19,476. This was due to planned expenditure on Property to install new hall boilers and new rear windows at a combined cost of £24,000. A reduction by Edinburgh on Mission and Ministry due to vacancy helped offset. 2023 will be a challenge to consolidate our normal income level as tax reclaimed will fall due to reduced Gift Aid givings. The impact on Finances of a prolonged vacancy is uncertain.

Investment Policy and Performance

The charity Investment objectives are to protect capital and maximise income. The investments are in Church of Scotland Investment Trust Deposits and Income Fund.

Risk Management

There is an ongoing concern that with the congregation reducing in numbers due to age profile, that a gap of general expenditure over income will transpire. Mitigation for this is our participation in the rolling Stewardship campaign focusing alternately on Time, Talents and Money to make best use of resources available. Expenditure under our control is closely monitored.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees policy to hold reserves of at least six months general expenditure (£50k for coming year) not including organisations designated funds as they operate own accounts. At the year end the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £92,228. This comprises £79,175 for general purposes and £3,025 designated for Property maintenance. There is £10,028 in Church Organisations designated accounts operated by them. Whilst this represents greater than six months expenditure, it is anticipated that Reserves will be allocated for work required to the manse prior to the vacancy being filled. We will then be operating at minimum finance levels.

The Church also hold £14,457 of restricted cash funds and Endowment investments of £5,460 which have been provided for the purposes specified in Note 2

Structure, Governance and Management

The Congregation is a registered charity,number SC004660 and is administered in accordance with the Unitary constitution and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the Ordained Elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. The Kirk Session meets at least 6 times per year and is responsible for the Temporal and spiritual affairs within the Church. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance and Property Committee as appropriate

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Beith Parish Church
